Assemblyman Huffman Endorses Torliatt

Torliatt Also Reports Continued Fundraising Lead

Petaluma, CA – Mayor Pamela Torliatt announced today that she received the endorsement of Assemblyman Jared Huffman in the runoff election for Sonoma County Supervisor in the 2nd District. Huffman cited Torliatt's experience and dedication to smart growth and job creation in his endorsement.

"Mayor Torliatt has the skills and experience we need to help create jobs and revitalize our economy in Sonoma County," said Huffman. "I've worked with Pamela on a number of important issues and I know that she will be an effective advocate on the Board of Supervisors. I look forward to working with her to bring good jobs to the North Bay."

Torliatt also reported that she continues to lead the race in fundraising. As of Monday's financial reports, Torliatt reported raising almost \$20,000 more than her opponent during the last period. She raised \$36,745 while David Rabbit only reported raising \$18,867. Torliatt also reported having about \$52,000 in cash-on-hand, while Rabbitt only reported having about \$1,600 on hand, giving her a significant advantage.

Torliatt, the smart growth and pro-job creation candidate in this race, has also received endorsements from Congresswoman Lynn Woolsey, State Senators Mark Leno and Pat Wiggins, Assemblymembers Wesley Chesbro and Noreen Evans, and a large list of local elected officials, community leaders, and organizations.
